

**Quick Search** provides searching like Google in its simplicity, with library-quality results. The system is most useful for:

- users whose search experience is shaped by Google
- novice library searchers who do not know where to begin
- students looking quickly for a few articles, not necessarily the best articles or all articles

Like any federated search system, Quick Search is not the tool for “power” searching. Graduate students and researchers who need the most comprehensive and authoritative results are better served by the specialized databases in their field. Only a specialized database interface can provide sophisticated tools such as a thesaurus, proximity operators, specialized limits, complex export options, etc.

## How to Use QuickSearch – link on the Maly Library Research Databases page

1. Select the subject area for your search.
2. Enter one or more search terms, using AND for terms to be searched together, OR for terms to be searched separately, and NOT for terms to be excluded; for example, gestalt AND grief. If a word has several forms, you can use a ? to truncate at the stem; for example, adolescen? will search for adolescent, adolescence, and adolescents.


Abstract: Parental engagement in the treatment process is influenced by parents' beliefs about the cause of their children's problems, perceptions about their ability to handle such problems, and expectations about the ability of therapy to help them. This paper examines the role of parental cognitions related to attributions and expectations in relation to engagement in child mental health treatment. Reviewed studies indicate that parental attributions and expectations influence three aspects of treatment: help seeking, engagement and retention, and outcome. This paper integrates findings from developmental and clinical research, highlights gaps in the literature, presents the beginnings of a model regarding the parental attributional process as it relates to engagement in treatment, recommends future research directions, and discusses clinical implications.

A box will display giving you the option of emailing the records or saving them to a disk. Unfortunately, you cannot directly print a list of the records without emailing or saving them first.

#### 6. To get a full-text copy of an article:

If there is an “External” link at the bottom of the full record, click on it. If the article is available in one of our databases in full-text, it will open. If the link only refers you to the source or if there is no link, contact a staff librarian to request a copy of the article. These requests usually take 5 to 7 days to fill, so plan ahead.
